On spot billing training is ongoing. Other areas are also represented including Bushenyi, Kasese and Ibanda.

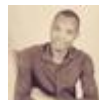

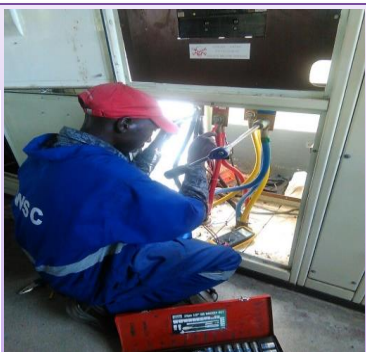
