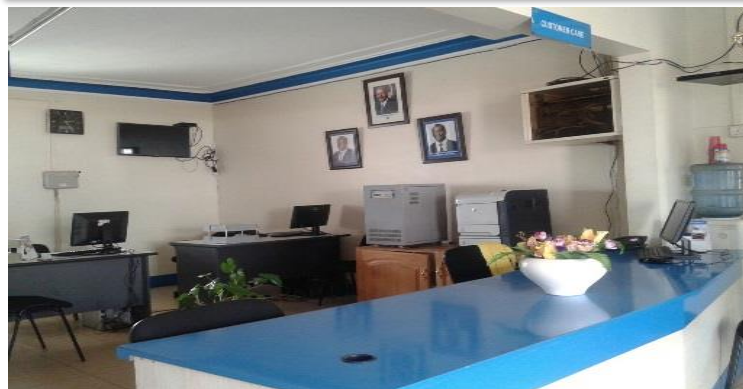

Excavation of the path for the Naguru bulk water line have started. The interconnection from Centenary Park will improve levels at the Naguru reservoir. The works, which will also include a booster station will deliver 6million litres of water per day to the reservoir. This will benefit the water stressed areas of Kulambiro, Kyanja, Buwate, Najjera some parts of Kisasi and Komamboga. Project should be completed in Sept/Oct this year.
