Arua Receives Consignment Of 2.2Kms Of DN 100, 1Km Of Dn80 And New Connection Pipes



The Arua area has received a consignment of pipes to enable water extensions of 11Kms from Euata to Ocoko. Once laid, the connection will bring clean water to residents of Euata, Kulva, Ringili, Dubai and Ocoko through which it passes. The extension will also bring water to institutions like Kulva Hospital, UCU Arua campus at Ringili and the Ocoko tobacco factory.

To reassure the public on NWSC's Water quality, teams were out in Bugolobi market, Luzira market, Kireka, Katanga Wandegaya, Nakawa market, Kubiri, Bwaise, Kyebando testing the water. All sample points were found to be safe

NWSC explains lakeshore stench

Previously thought to result from NWSC emitting effluent, they explained that the smell is attributed to decomposing weeds and green algae.
