## UNBS; NWSC Water Is Safe

With public opinion divided as to the safety of water supplied by NWSC, the corporation has received a boost following the release of results by Uganda National Bureau of Standards (UNBS). The results, published on the NWSC website (under latest news) show what was previously known, that water supplied by NWSC meets local and international standards for safe water. The news is welcome at a time when some sections of society are still in doubt due to malicious messages being spread by dubious individuals. In a related development, ChimpReports, an online news outlet which had previously published a story claiming fecal matter had been found in NWSC water has changed its stance. The website today, 25<sup>th</sup> March, published a story which clears NWSC of any contaminated water claims.
