As part of NWSC's drive to ensure safe water for all and continuous stakeholder management, the Nebbi team has commissioned PSPs in the new service area of Omyer. The launches were attended by the LCV Nebbi district and residents of the area. They will also be visiting Koch, Lajji and River Omyer villages as part of the sensitisation drive.

Ongoing works at the Nakivubo Sewerage treatment plant Bugolobi. When completed, it will treat 45million liters of waste water daily and also produce 630 KW of electricity to power its operations.
