## 4 PSPs Commissioned In Kawuku

With access to safe water a key driving force behind NWSC, the Entebbe team has commissioned 4 Public Stand Pipes in the Kawuku area. The managers at the water selling points were discouraged from charging exorbitant prices and were advised to sell a jerry can at 50shs.
